The Project "Oeste Adapta – Planning for Municipal Climate Adaptation in the West Region", within the scope of the SGS#3 Tender Notice - Projects to strengthen adaptation to climate change at the local level, launched under the Environment, Climate Change and Economy of Low Carbon (Environment Programme), has a duration of 24 months, a total cost of €233,640.00, and is 85% co-financed (€198,594.00) by the European Economic Area Financial Mechanism (MFEEE / EEA Grants).

The Project "Oeste Adapta - Planning for Municipal Climate Adaptation in the West Region", is led by OesteCIM - Intermunicipal Community of the West, in partnership with CEDRU - Centro de Estudos e Desenvolvimento Regional e Urbano, Lda and Vestlandsforsking (Western Norway Research Institute).).

Essentially, the Oeste Adapta Project is composed of 3 components that aim to provide the Municipalities of the West with instruments to promote climate adaptation and human resources prepared to ensure its implementation and monitoring, but also with local communities informed and prepared to deal with climate change.
